**Student membership** provides all the benefits of Professional membership at a special student rate. Student members must be a full-time student at an accredited college or university; or a part-time student who is not engaged in full-time employment as a certified professional in the field of education.

**Associate membership** is for parents and family members who do not work full-time in the field of education, paraprofessionals, and the general public. Associate members have on-line access to the CEC journals, but do not receive hard copy by mail.

**Joint membership** provides all the benefits of Professional membership for two persons. The pair of members receive one set of CEC professional publications (TEACHING Exceptional Children and Exceptional Children), but maintain two separate "files" so that each can join different divisions.

**Retired membership** provides all the benefits of Professional membership at a special rate. CEC Divisions are special organizations which concentrate on a particular exceptionality of children or a unique aspect of special education. Divisions publish journals and newsletters and hold conferences and workshops for members. Only CEC members are eligible for membership in CEC Professional Divisions.

- **Council of Administrators of Special Education (CASE)**—members receive the *Journal of Special Education Leadership* two times each year and six newsletters.
- **Council for Children with Behavioral Disorders (CCBD)**—members receive four issues of *Behavioral Disorders*, three issues of *Beyond Behavior*, and six newsletters.
- **Division for Research (CEC-DR)**—members receive the *Journal of Special Education* quarterly, four newsletters, and two issues of *Current Practice Alerts*.
- **CEC Pioneers Division (CEC-PD)**—members receive three newsletters and an annual Membership Directory (upon request). Membership in CEC-PD is open only to persons who have been members of CEC for 20 years or more, Life, or Retired members.
- **Council for Educational Diagnostic Services (CEDS)**—members receive *Assessment for Effective Intervention* and a newsletter, quarterly.
- **Division for Communicative Disabilities and Deafness (DCDD)**—members receive four issues of *Communication Disorders Quarterly*, and four newsletters.
- **Division on Career Development and Transition (DCDT)**—members receive two issues of *Career Development for Exceptional Individuals* and two newsletters.
- **Division on Developmental Disabilities (DDD)**—members receive *Education and Training in Developmental Disabilities, Focus on Autism and Other Developmental Disabilities*, and a newsletter quarterly.
- **Division for Culturally and Linguistically Diverse Exceptional Learners (DDEL)**—members receive one issue of *Multiple Voices for Ethnically Diverse Exceptional Learners* and two newsletters.
- **Division for Early Childhood (DEC)**—members receive the *Journal of Early Intervention, Young Exceptional Children*, and a newsletter, quarterly.
- **Division of International Special Education and Services (DISES)**—members receive one issue of the *Journal of International Special Needs Education* and three newsletters.
- **Division for Learning Disabilities (DLD)**—members receive *Learning Disabilities Research and Practice* quarterly, three newsletters, and two issues of *Current Practice Alerts*.
- **Division for Physical and Health Disabilities (DPHD)**—members receive *Physical Disabilities: Education and Related Services* twice yearly and two newsletters.
- **Division on Visual Impairments (DVI)**—members receive the DVI newsletter quarterly.
- **The Association for the Gifted (TAG)**—members receive the *Journal for the Education of the Gifted* and a newsletter, quarterly.
- **Technology and Media Division (TAM)**—members receive the *Journal of Special Education Technology* and a newsletter, quarterly.
